Important Registration Information:

- Current Annual Membership AND onetime 2026 annual registration fee required to attend summer camp.
- 25-26 membership valid July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026.
- 26-27 membership valid July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027.
- Camp space is limited and registration is based on a first come, first serve basis.
- **Payments are accepted from 9:00am – 5:00pm in person.** Only authorized personnel (Membership Clerk or Branch Manager) can accept payments.
- **Payments must be received by Wednesday prior to the week of attendance** to ensure your spot. Space in the upcoming week will not be guaranteed without payment.
- **Payments can be made by exact cash amount,** check or credit/debit card. Checks resulting in insufficient funds will be charged a return fee and eliminated as a method of payment.
- If paying with cash, please come with the exact total as our Clubs do not carry change.
- Families on automatic payment will have their cards charged on Tuesday.
- In the event of outstanding, incomplete or non-payment, your family will be unable to attend Club activities until payment has been made in full, no exceptions.
- Please contact us at a minimum of one week prior to each week of the camp start date if your camper will not be attending the week that they are registered for. Failure to contact us will result in a credit card charge to anyone registered and on automatic payment.

- Preference is given to families who attend on a consistent basis. If you fail to bring your camper regularly, your spot may be given to someone on the waitlist.
- Refunds may be granted if the request is made the Wednesday prior to that week of Day Camp. There are no partial refunds for weeks not fully attended. This includes removal from the program due to disciplinary reasons and/or sickness.

Special Needs:

- The Club is committed to providing the best possible experience for all participants. If your camper has any special needs, please communicate those needs with staff at the time of registration.
- Our ratios are 1 adult for 20 youth in Camp and 1 adult for 15 youth for field trips.
- We cannot provide one-on-one support. Children must be able to participate within their groups.
- If your camper requires medication while they are at the Club, please make sure to complete the medication form. Staff cannot administer medication without a completed form on file.

Summer with a Goal (S.W.A.G.):

S.W.A.G. is an educational program offered to all Day campers. SWAG was designed to include engaging and fun academic activities in the typical Summer Day Camp experience. You can expect to see SWAG happening throughout the summer. A variety of activities will be offered during the SWAG hour. For a more detailed schedule of SWAG activities, please see your Branch Manager.

Camp Expectations:

Camp hours are Monday-Friday, 7:30am to 5:30pm. Most Camp trips leave at 9:00 am (some may be earlier, please check the schedule to ensure you are on time). Members need to be checked in and ready to go as the bus will be loaded and leaving on time each day. Below you will find additional policies and day-to-day procedures that apply to all campers. Please read and initial the following:

- ❑ Please instruct your camper that they/he/she should not leave the building unless accompanied by an adult staff member. This rule will also be stressed and reinforced by Boys & Girls Club staff.
- ❑ Campers may only be signed out and released by authorized person(s) listed on their membership application. Please be prepared to always show your I.D. Anyone picking up a Club Member must provide identification to the front desk at the time of pick up. No person will be allowed to remove children from the Club if they are not listed as an authorized person on the membership application, even if the child recognizes them.
- ❑ Club hours are 7:30am to 5:30pm. Please make the necessary arrangements to have your campers picked- up no later than 5:30pm. Any pick-up after 5:30pm is considered a late pick-up. After 3 late pick-ups, your campers may be dropped from the program.
- ❑ Lunch and afternoon snacks are not provided at every camp location. Please check with your club to see if your site qualifies and receives no cost lunch and snacks daily. If not, please make sure your children bring their own lunch and snack. The Club does NOT provide bowls, plates or the ability to cook lunches.
- ❑ The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen items. All belongings, especially swimsuits and towels, should be taken home every day. Lost and found is held for a period of one week and then donated to a charitable organization. This includes cell phones or any electronic device. – Please leave all valuables at home.
- ❑ Children are allowed to have cell phones with them but are expected to remain engaged in the programming offered. They may respond to a parent’s call or text but otherwise are not to be on phones or any type of electronics while at the Boys & Girls Club. The Club is not responsible for the content viewed by your campers or other campers personal cell phones. ***The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen phones or other valuables.***
- ❑ Field Trips or “Staycations at the Club Events” occur each week. All Club Members are expected to follow all rules for the safety of themselves and others. Failure to follow the rules on off-site trips will result in removal from future trips.
- ❑ We consider our programs to be a partnership between the families and Club staff. We will do what is necessary to make this a successful summer for you and your camper. We ask that all parents, guardians, and family members please show respect to our staff, volunteers, and other members. Any aggressive or disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated and will be subject to removal from the programs.
- ❑ To ensure the safety of all participants, the Club will not serve children whose behavior is likely to result in injury to themselves or others, who are at risk to leave the premises without permission, whose disability is so severe they cannot participate in a majority of Club activities, who require assistance to use the toilet or who require a personal aide while attending school and whose aide does not accompany them at all times to the Club.

Field Trip and Water Safety Policies (please initial below):

- All trip participants are required to follow trip guidelines at all times. The guidelines are as follows:
 - Must adhere to all staff directions and instructions.
 - Must remain with assigned group and staff member.
 - Must follow all safety rules and regulations on the bus and during the trip.
 - Must refrain from vulgar and obscene language and gestures.
- All trip participants are required to follow water safety rules at all times. The guidelines are as follows:
 - Lifeguards will conduct swim tests with all children prior to swimming each day. Any child who does not pass the swim test will be asked to reside in the shallow end of the pool during swimming activities.
 - Please come prepared to swim in appropriate swim wear.
 - Flip flops or other sandals should be worn on the pool deck only.
 - Please let the Branch Manager know ahead of time regarding your camper's swimming ability.
 - Staff are not allowed to apply sunscreen.
- Disobedient and rowdy behavior will not be tolerated. If a participant does not follow these rules, he/she will be prohibited from attending future trips.
- Members may not be picked up or dropped off at a field trip location. They can only be signed out at the Club site, according to Club policy.
- It is mandatory to wear a Club t-shirt on all trips. Two shirts will be provided and additional shirts may be purchased.
- Participants must arrive at the Club **on time** so that they may be assigned a group and properly checked in. Check in times for each trip are listed at the Club. There will be no refunds or exchanges given on trips missed due to late arrival.

- All children must be picked up by 5:30 p.m. After three late pick-ups, children may be removed from the program.
- All payments are due by the Wednesday before Camp by 5:00 p.m.
- Anyone picking up your camper must have an ID/Driver's License and be listed on the approved pick-up list.
- The Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater San Diego is not responsible for lost or stolen items. This includes, but is not limited to cell phones, electronics, toys, clothing, bikes, and scooters.
- Parents may not drop off or pick up members from any field trip.
- It is the responsibility of the parent to read through the parent handbook.
- If a child arrives to camp after a field trip has departed from the facility, there is no supervision at the Club for that child. The parent cannot leave the camper at the site.
- All parents, guardians, family members will be respectful to all staff, children, and volunteers. Aggressive and disrespectful behavior will result in removal from the program. All concerns will be addressed to the Branch Manager.
